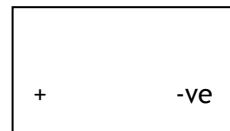

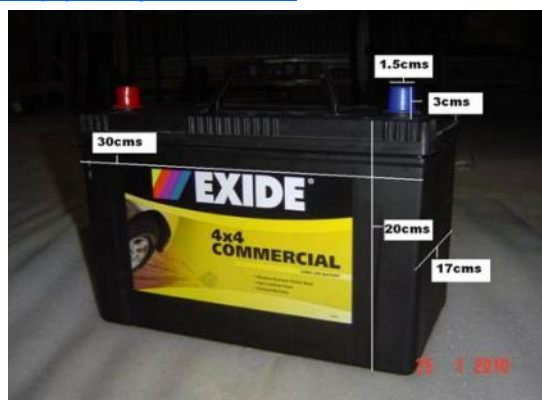

Trip Reports

Christmas in July 29 -31 July 2011

As the last person to arrive at the Toorong Falls campground, located on the outskirts of Noojee, the 'camp committee' (of which there were many) thought it only fair that the lucky last to arrive also be the one to compile the trip report for our club's first Christmas in July trip.

The track that led to the campground was a combination of gravel and dirt road. It was easy 2WD and quite suitable for all manner of vehicles. There looked like an interesting track off to one side as I made my way towards the falls and our nominated campground but, as I was keen to get to my destination and in stones' throw of the site, I pressed on noting that fresh tyre marks had been laid. As it turned out, I missed the single lane entry point that would take passersby to the club's camp site and I soon found myself heading past camp - towards the Toorong Falls car park - as I traversed the road above. Following a quick u-turn, I soon made my way along a short track to where the club's campsite was situated. The campground itself was a rather flat but muddy area due to a combination of the inclement weather that we experienced in the days preceding, as well as the number of vehicles with campers, caravans and trailers in tow. Being the last, I arrived around 1:30 pm on the Saturday afternoon and the camp ground was quite full (there were 2 other groups camped alongside us which made for a tight fit) by that stage. It turned out that some others from within the club had only just pulled in within a short space of time before me and were still in the process of setting up when I arrived.



After a quick scout around, I quickly located a suitably flat and still grassed section of the site to pitch my small tent. Within 5-10 minutes I was done and it was time to wander down to the main fire to join the large circle of members who were already busy chatting and enjoying a bevy. Within an hour or two of arrival, one club secretary (aka David B) thought that it might be worth seeing whether anyone was up for a short stint up the 'interesting' looking side track that we all passed on our way in. It didn't take long before some interest was garnered and soon myself, with club editor Catherine and her husband Mark as passengers in tow, and Sam (with his vivid green shorty, cheese-cutting



Centipedes and David B. riding shot gun) were on our way to 'investigate' this track. It took all of about a split-second before we decided that it would be an interesting way to test our ability to read a track and to simply 'give it a go'. Sam was first to head up the track (I was brandishing the capable but less aggressive MTZs and needed to air down a tad before I would be ready) and, despite the slippery conditions, he apparently charged to the top in style. The only problem was what to do once at the top for, apparently, the track just ran to a narrow dead end and necessitated a fair bit of reversing in order to retreat to a suitable spot and turn-around. With the help of a couple of spotters (Mark and David on the hand-helds), Sam managed to about-face and was soon on his way back down. Next, it was my turn...

With the hubs locked, front and rear lockers in, tyres aired down, and low range second engaged, I preceded at a cautious but moderate pace. The suspension felt its way through the ruts and I was soon clear of the worst as well. Given the difficulty that Sam had had in turning his shorty around, we felt it best to avoid the same situation given my longer-wheel base. We found a suitable spot to turn back and, while necessitating a 3 point turn to complete it, I was also soon back down the hill. The funny thing was, going down was arguable worse than going up and I soon found myself questioning why my vehicle was even fitted with a steering wheel because it didn't matter which way you turned the wheel, the track (which its slippery clay surface) had plotted its own course for me. The only saving grace was that I left the rear locker in just to help anchor the back wheels whilst I wrestled with the front end. Shortly after returning back to camp, the skies darkened a little and it soon began to spit. This gradually turned into rain and we were soon scrambling to erect a common shelter for all to use. With many hands at the pass, the shelter was soon up and we were able to keep dry by the fire's side.

By around 6 pm, trip leader Dan and co-pilot Luke headed back towards the Noojee pub where they met up with the club's nominated caterer for the evening. They returned with a smorgasbord of foods, including various roasts, assorted salads, bread rolls, sauces and other condiments, plus everyone's favourite, dessert.

Everybody tucked in while the roast was still hot and we were all left feeling very content by day's end. After later consuming dessert, we all settled in around the large and inviting fire, playing musical chairs (not literally) as we mixed, mingled and chatted with various club members. It was a very enjoyable night and for some, that drifted into early morning...

On Sunday morning the club had organised to cook up a lovely bacon and egg breakfast for all members in

attendance. This was a great start to the day and helped to heat everyone up as we stood out in the slightly damp conditions and cool morning air. By around mid morning, some were still waiting for the sun while most in the camp were well advanced with their packing up of gear, campers, tents and vehicles. As the day drifted on, we gradually made our respective ways back towards home.

Special thanks must go out to those that volunteered their time and effort into organising what was a very enjoyable and successful club Christmas in July.
