Best mod you ever did to a car?

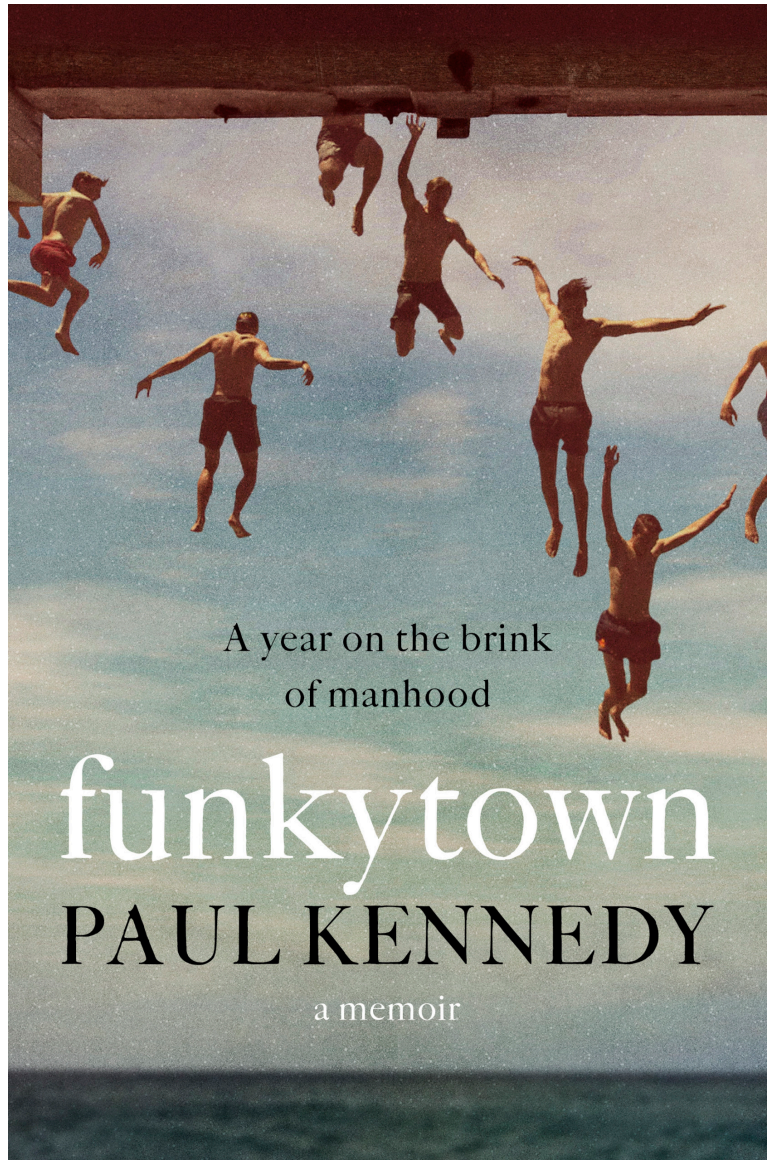
I'd say the drawers and fridge slide, mainly because we did it ourselves otherwise the best mod will be the next one.....we've only just started.

Friday 25th:

Sheepyard Flats nestled in the historic Hawqua Hills welcomed us with a crisp and chilly evening. We soon got the fire going to welcome the group as we assembled for Saturday's adventure. Everyone was in good spirits and happy to be away. The night air was chilly and we had a shower of rain overnight, but that just added to the anticipation.



Saturday 26th:

We found everyone but Ian and Libby had a leaking Ranger. With some investigating, it was found to be the transmission. They decided to take the day to relax and chill while we headed out on our adventures. We headed off up Brook's Road to Tunnel Bend for a short walk. The Victorian 4x4 Wheel Drive Club, VFWD, organised a weekend trip to Sheepyard Flats, nestled in the historic Howqua hills, from the 25/11/2022. The group, enjoyed the challenging drive to the iconic hut and the spectacular scenery that unfolded, but the most rewarding part of the weekend, was a random act of kindness. We set up camp, started a fire, and watched as a group of walkers, came in. They were girls on a thirty day walk through this area. They had wet tents, socks, and were just soggy in general. We started a conversation with the group leader, and asked if they could have a fire? We took wood and fire lighting apparatus down to the fire pit nearest their camp. We assisted in starting the fire, and stacking the wood, explaining they needed a bucket of water to put it out, at the end of the night. We headed back to our camp. It was lovely to hear the girls happy voices around the fire

The next morning the girls had packed up their camp, and before starting their walk for the day, they came up with a note, to thank us. They were grateful as they had been able to dry their socks, and feel warm before bed.

It's just a thought that we take it for granted as we travel through areas, we have chain saws, axes, fire lighters. As prepared campers with vehicles its not difficult to leave a pile of wood, because you never know who will be there after you. We all try to do the right thing, and it was this act of kindness towards the walkers that we agreed was our highlight of the weekend.
